

Commanding a person to do something he is already doing

With regards to directing a commands towards someone who is already fulfilling that command, the Shaykh Muhammad ibn Saalih al 'Uthaymeen *rahimahullaah* comments on hadeeth number 10 of an Nawawee's 40:

Benefit no 10:

Directing the command to the one who (already) possesses (that) attribute – as per His statement:

(O Messengers! Eat from the foods which are *tayyib*) and work righteous deeds...

Soorah al Mu-minoon (23) aayah 51

So the command to perform righteous deeds was directed to the Messengers, despite them (already) performing righteous deeds – and there is no doubt about that.

And this is like His statement, He the Most High, to His Messenger Muhammad sall Allaahu 'alaihi wa sallam:

O Prophet, have tagwaa (fear and dutifulness to) Allaah...

Soorah al Ahzaab (33) aayah 1

And His statement:

And when you said to him, upon whom Allaah had bestowed Favour and upon whom you had bestowed favour, "Keep your wife to yourself and have *taqwaa* of Allaah." But you did hide in yourself that which Allaah will make manifest...

Soorah al Ahzaab (33) aayah 37

So in these aayaat, Allaah commanded His Messenger sall Allaahu 'alaihi wa sallam to (have) taqwaa - despite his sall Allaahu 'alaihi wa sallam being the person from the people with the most taqwaa of Allaah, the Mighty and Majestic.

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And were to to be said to one of us – and we are people who fall short – "Fear Allaah!", he would become filled with anger.

And if were said to him, "May Allaah guide you!", he would certainly say, "And what is it that I am supposed to have fallen into?".

And (yet) the Messenger of Allaah sall Allaahu 'alaihi wa sallam was being addressed by his Lord, with His statement:

O Prophet, have taqwaa (fear and dutifulness to) Allaah...

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Soorah al Ahzaab (33) aayah 1

So the Messengers 'alaihim us salaatu was salaam were commanded with doing righteous deeds, even though they were (already) doing them – affirming for them that which they were upon, in order that they continue upon doing it.
